Course Description	Drama 400 is an advanced course in the technique and creativity of the
	actor. It will focus on the research and application of acting resources in
	and through performance. NB The Friday lab of Drama 400 (Voice and
	Movement) will have separate instructors and course outlines.

	performance
	To employ acting technique as a means of problem solving in the
	interpretation of texts for performance
	To employ acting technique as a means of creative invention in the
	rehearsal and performance of texts
	To acquire a personal toolkit of technical and creative resources that
	support critical practice and creative freedom
	To deepen responsibility for one's own learning through acquired
	strategies for self-assessment
	To acquire and practice ethical attitudes and work habits appropriate to a
	living, collaborative art form.

Assessment	The work of this M/W portion of Drama 400 will constitute two-
	thirds of the final grade in the course.
	The other one-third of the grade will be derived from work done in
	the Friday Voice and Movement labs.

	In this portion of the course, process will take precedence over
	immediate result. A gradual accumulation of artistic understandings and
	practices is sought in an atmosphere that encourages both freedom and
	discipline. There will be no formal examinations; assignments will be
	shown in class at various stages of development and assessed
	continuously.
	Students will be required to reflect critically on their own work and that
	of their peers and to participate in self-assessment in consultation with
	the instructor.
	The degree to which a student commits to process, the degree to which
	s/he improves and grows during the course of an assignment will be
	given careful consideration in all assessments. Furthermore, the
	cooperative requirements of acting will always be considered in the
	evaluation of individual efforts.
	Final grades in this M/W portion of the course (two-thirds of the final
	grade in Drama 400) will be determined as follows:

	Winter Creative Technique25%
	Winter Scene Study25%
	Classroom Participation

	Classroom participation includes ongoing evaluation of the following:
	1)work and rehearsal habits 2)responsibility to fellow actors
	3) willingness to take artistic risks 4) contribution to classroom discussion
	and critiques 5)cumulative growth and development.
