It is a collection of physical activities and exercises that support the students' creativity, imagination, and physical vocabulary. The course material has been designed to directly address actor development, awareness skills both individual and ensemble, and physical endurance. There will be an expectation of the student to integrate the work into all aspects of their craft.
