Special attention will be paid to sentence mechanics and grammar.		
	You will view and discuss dance videos, attend dance concerts, and write a series of responses to what you have seen. In addition, you will choose a topic in Dance and write a series of well-researched, carefully written, and meticulously edited essays, culminating in a Research Paper. You will also write a carefully constructed cover letter in application for a grant, job, or internship.
