General: The courses will consist of weekly lectures and seminar discussions. There will

be assigned in-class musical analysis exercises, as well as readings. The course will explore the relationship between politics, social culture, art, literature, and (especially) music in the Viennese orbit during the period from about 1880 to

1918—the twilight of the Austro-Hungarian Empire.

There will be a listening component for the class that will be tested on the midterm tests and the final examination. The details of the listening are given on

the course syllabus.

Term Papers:

Two writing assignments are required. The first paper will consist of a short formal/structural analysis of a late piano piece by Brahms taken (students' choice) from the collection of pieces Op. 118. This assignments should be about 4 pages in length (1000) words. Details on how to do the analysis will be provided in class.

The second writing assignment will be a formal term paper on some aspect of music and culture during the period under discussion. Topics will be chosen by the student in consultation with the instructor and suggestions will be provided. Papers should employ appropriate academic documentation according Trevor Herbert, *Music in Words*. Marks will be taken off for late papers at the instructor's digression.

Final Exam:

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There will be a final examination scheduled by the registrar that will be held during the final examination period. The final examination will be worth 20% of the final grade.
